

Systems-Centered Training (SCT) is a practical and innovative systemic approach that teaches how to take up one's role as an agent of change, both for the self and for other living human systems (individuals, groups, organizations). Pioneered by Yvonne Agazarian, SCT begins with the idea that we are always in a system, be it the system of ourselves as a person, a couple, a family, a team, or a whole organization. SCT posits that these different systems heavily influence how we function within them. Our ongoing challenge is how to contribute to building the kind of systems in which we want to live and work. At this conference we will explore the "us vs. them" dynamic and the methods and tools that can shift any system toward collaboration.
